Reentry Specialist Recertification: Code of Conduct

Every two years, the NRWC-Certified Reentry Specialist is required to go through a process of being recertified. The goal is to ensure that each Reentry Specialist keeps up with learnings in the field, reaffirms the principles of the code of conduct and demonstrates alignment in practice.

When should I take the recertification?

Within 90 days of your current Reentry Specialist Certification expiration.

What is included in the Reentry Specialist Code of Conduct course?

Participants receive the Code of Conduct guide and access to the course for one month. The course takes less than two hours and includes knowledge checks, a commitment statement, and a final assessment.

Are continuing education units required to get recertified?

Not at this time, although it may become a requirement in the future. Advance notice will be provided.

What do I get after I'm recertified?

Successful completion provides two additional years of Reentry Specialist Certification.
